We SHOULD Protest!

Protests have spread from Wall Street, to Bank of America in Boston, to cities and towns around the country:

- Against the predatory role of the banks;
- Against the corruption that runs all through business and government;
- Against wealth for a few, while everyone else loses out.

The media say the protests are disorganized, that the protestors are "scruffy" looking. Maybe, but so what?

These protests are the symptom of a "scruffy" economic system:

- A system that puts people out in the street without a job, as though they were trash to be thrown away;
- One that cuts wages and eliminates pensions;
- One that offers no prospects for the next generation.

And these protests are the symptom of a "scruffy" political system, in which the vast majority has no say:

- A system that uses the power of the state to bail out the banks and reinforce the wealth of people already monstrously wealthy;
- One that lowers our standard of living to do it.

Some unions say they are going to support the demonstrations.

- It's not enough! Not nearly enough.
- The working class has power over production when it mobilizes. Use that power.
- Fight for goals that benefit all working people: a job for everyone, a decent wage that lets everyone live without worry. Everyone would benefit.
- Fight to make the banks pay for the crisis they created.
